



2024 Guernsey County Junior Fair Rule and Procedure Changes

(Reviewed & Approved by Senior Fair Board)

Beef

1. Dairy Market Steers must weigh 850 lbs. at fair weigh-in to be able to sell in the Jr. Fair Livestock Sale.
2. The top five place beef feeder calves in each class will be brought back for the final drive.
3. Only the exhibitor and one other person per exhibitor are permitted in the make-up area prior to entering the show arena.
4. Feeder Calves – Exhibitors are required to have the ear tags physically placed in the calf's ear and pictures submitted to the Jr. Fair Beef Committee by August 1. Exhibitors can register up to three calves and exhibit and sell two calves. If there are multiple exhibitors in one household, calves can be registered in the household name with no more than an average of three calves per exhibitor registered. Calves will then be assigned to a specific exhibitor during fair weigh-in. Specific procedural instructions for tag location and picture submission will be given at tag pick-up.

Dairy

1. Dairy Check-in meeting will be on Sunday prior to fair, time TBA.
2. Dairy project participants may lease an animal for their project animal if the animal is not owned by a member of the exhibitor's household. An approved lease must be submitted for all animals not owned by a member of the exhibitor's household. Dairy Lease must be submitted with the Guernsey County Jr. Fair Dairy Cattle Breeding Animal Lease Contract Agreement by June 1.

Equine

1. Delete "No leases will be considered." from the hardship case rules.
2. Schedule changes: Jumping classes will move to Wednesday and Cart classes will move to Thursday.
3. Premier Exhibitor – Exhibitors must pick one showmanship class and one non-showmanship class.

Boer Goat

1. Market Goats – Exhibitors can register up to three goats and exhibit and sell two goats. If there are multiple exhibitors in one household, goats can be registered in the household name with no more than an average of three goats per exhibitor registered. Goats will then be assigned to a specific exhibitor during fair weigh-in.

Dairy Goat

1. All goats must arrive on Sunday prior to fair between 10:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. through Gate 3.
2. Dairy Goat Weigh-in will be Sunday prior to fair from 6:00 – 7:00 p.m.
3. The Dairy Goat Barn meeting will be Sunday at 5:30 p.m.
4. The Dairy/Pygmy/Pack Goat Show will be Monday at 9:00 a.m.
5. Market Goats – Exhibitors are required to have the ear tag physically placed in the goat's ear and pictures submitted to the Jr. Fair Dairy Goat Committee by June 19. Exhibitors can register up to three goats and exhibit and sell two goats. If there are multiple exhibitors in one household, goats can be registered in the household name with no more than an average of three goats per exhibitor registered. Goats will then be assigned to a specific

exhibitor during fair weigh-in. Specific procedural instructions for tag location and picture submission will be given at tag pick-up on June 5 from 5:00 – 8:00 p.m. at the Fairgrounds.

Poultry

1. None

Rabbit

1. None

Sheep

1. Exhibitors are limited to two head of sheep in each sheep breeding class.

Swine

1. Market hogs must weigh 220 - 300 pounds at fair weigh-in to be eligible for sale.
2. Delete the requirement of submitting the Swine Breeding Record Book for eligibility to show in the Bred & Owned class.

General

1. Youth exhibitors must be in good standing and eligible to exhibit through all Junior Fair organizations and/or all Junior Fair Livestock Shows organized by a county agricultural society or independent agricultural society. Disciplinary action from another county agricultural society or independent fair will be honored at the Guernsey County Fair.

Sale

1. Market Beef Steers and Market Dairy Beef Steers will rotate for sale order. Rotation will begin with Market Beef Steers following Market Dairy Beef Steers in 2024.
2. Poultry are not permitted to be given back after going through the sale.
