Youth Information and Opportunities

Still Project Judging

All youth enrolled in a food, clothing or miscellaneous 4-H project should have marked their calendars for 4-H Still Project Judging on Thursday, **July 7th** at Cambridge High School.

Youth will be scheduling a judging appointment time for each project based on the project area of the project being judged. Members can find their project on the Still Project Judging by Area sheet on page 4 of this newsletter.

Members will then register online for their judging appointment at <http://go.osu.edu/gc4hjjudging>.

Members must be registered by 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 5th.

Appointment times are scheduled every 10 minutes beginning at 9:00 a.m. There will not be a general waiting area in the High School.

Members will check in 10 minutes before their interview time and be placed in a waiting chair for their judge. Members with multiple projects will register an

appointment time for each project separately. Members with multiple projects can try to register their appointments close in time, but not in back-to-back time slots.

Youth must participate in Still Project Judging on July 7th to be eligible for county awards and state fair participation. Be sure to review project judging requirements for your specific project, found in the [4-H Member and Volunteer Handbook](#), so you are prepared when you come to judging.

*Clothing & Textile Science

Projects: Restrooms will be available for youth to change into their total look outfit. Points will be deducted for outfits not appropriate to the occasion implied in the project title.

**Nutrition & Food Science

Projects: Members need to review their project requirements on page 21 of the Member and Volunteer Handbook as there are changes for 2022. **NO food will be brought to judging!** Supplies will be provided for members to set a casual place setting.

***Writing Projects

Writing project writings must be **submitted to the Extension Office by 4:30 p.m. on July**

6th or the member will automatically lose 15 points.

Post Still Project Judging

Youth who are unable to attend regular Still Project Judging due to vacation, camp, etc. may have their project evaluated during Post Still Project Judging on Wednesday, **August 10th** at the Extension Office. Youth will receive a grade only. **Pre-registration is required** by calling the Extension Office at 740-489-5300 by noon on August 9th.

Livestock Committee Meetings

All specie livestock committee meetings are scheduled for Monday, **July 11th** at 7:00 p.m. at the Guernsey County Fairgrounds. The general session will take place in the Combs Pavilion behind the Grandstand. The Junior Fair Sale Committee will meet at 6:00 p.m.

Attention Feeder Calf Exhibitors

All Junior Fair Beef and Dairy-Beef Feeder Calves must be tagged with a special Guernsey County tamper-proof tag. Exhibitors are required to pre-register for tags by completing an online survey, <http://go.osu.edu/gcfeeder calf> by 11:59 p.m. on **July 10th**. Exhibitors will then be responsible for picking up their tags during Feeder Calf Tag Pick-up on Thursday, **July 14th** from 5:30 - 7:30 p.m. at Cambridge High School back parking lot. Each tag is \$5.00 and exhibitors are asked to have exact cash or a check made out to: Junior Fair Beef Committee ready to hand to the Beef Committee member.

Specie Royalty Applications

Several Junior Fair Specie Royalty Applications will be available [online](#) and at the Extension Office beginning July 12th. Completed applications are due **August 1st**. **The submission process is different**

by application, so please read them carefully! Some are due to the Extension Office by 4:30 p.m. in hard copy while others are online applications that are accepted until 11:59 p.m. The following species are included in this process:

- Beef
- Dairy
- Equine
- Boer Goat
- Poultry
- Rabbit
- Sheep
- Swine

Special Dairy Award Application

The award application for the Jim Smith Memorial Award is available [online](#) and at the Extension Office. Completed applications are due to the Junior Fair Dairy Committee by **August 1st**. The purpose of this award is to recognize the individual who has accomplished the most through their involvement in 4-H and FFA projects and activities within the area of dairy.

Livestock Skillathon Pre-registration Required

Livestock Skillathon is scheduled for **Thursday, July 14th** in the evening at the Cambridge High School. 4-H/FFA members must pre-register online for their judging time appointment. **Members can pre-register online at <http://go.osu.edu/gcskillathon>** and

must be pre-registered by July 12th.

Skillathon is open to any Guernsey County 4-H or FFA member for the livestock project area in which they are enrolled. Members planning to participate in Skillathon for multiple species will need to pre-register for each species.

- Members need to bring their up-to-date record book with them for each project as the judge at the first station will review it and ask them questions during the interview.

- Members will then participate in two skill stations. Participants will be tested on the Skillathon station topics listed in the [4-H Member & Volunteer Handbook](#). Junior: ages 8-12 and Seniors: age 13 and older as of January 1.

- Youth must participate in Skillathon to be eligible for [Premier Exhibitor](#) for their respective specie. Scores from Skillathon will count for 40% of the Premier Exhibitor final score.

- Participants will receive a \$2.00 premium from Senior Fair Board for each specie Skillathon they complete.

- The following specie incentives are being provided to 4-H/FFA members who participate in Skillathon by their respective Junior Fair Livestock Committee:

- Beef - \$5
- Dairy - \$5
- Equine - \$10
- Goat - plaque
- Poultry - T-Shirt
- Sheep - \$20

Swine Incentive for Premier Exhibitor

Swine Committee is offering a \$10 incentive for any swine exhibitor who competes in all three areas of premier exhibitor. Those areas include: Skillathon, Swine Showmanship and the Market Hog Show.

Equine Council Scholarship

Equine Council has \$1,000 in scholarship money to be awarded. Must have exhibited an equine project at least 2 consecutive years at the Guernsey County Fair and currently enrolled in the Equine Program. Complete & submit the [online Equine Council Scholarship Application](#) by 11:59 p.m. on **August 1st**.

Equine Body Condition Scoring (BCS)

It is mandatory for all horses

exhibiting at the Guernsey County Fair to participate in the Equine Council Body Scoring in order to attend Fair. Scores of 4-7 will be accepted. Equine Council will conduct BCS and offer a Shot Clinic on **August 3rd** from 6:00 - 8:00 p.m. at the Horse Barns at the Fairgrounds. A \$5.00 stall fee will be collected from each exhibitor during BCS. The fee covers the bedding for stalls.

Livestock Entry Forms

Livestock entry forms for all livestock being exhibited at the 2022 Guernsey County Fair must be completed through online submission by **August 1st**.

A full list of livestock entry forms can be found at <http://go.osu.edu/gclivestockentryforms>. Each livestock entry form will have a separate link to its own individual online entry. With the exception of equine, exhibitors will complete an entry form for each animal class being entered at the fair (one market steer = one entry, one set of broilers = one entry, one

goat = one entry). Equine exhibitors will be able to select all of the classes for one horse in one entry.

Both exhibitor and parent/guardian signatures are required on the entry. **Parent/Guardian: Please be sure to take your time and double check your entry before submitting it.**

After submitting an entry, exhibitors will be given the opportunity to click a link to complete another entry for the same species or click a link to return to the full list of entry forms, if needed. Exhibitors will receive a confirmation email of what information was entered on the entry. The email will be sent to the email address entered in the entry, so be sure it is correct. If you review your confirmation email and notice a mistake on your entry, you can submit a correction in writing to Michelle at fehr.19@osu.edu by the August 1 deadline.
